Call for Participation

To date, research on trust and cooperation in social systems has predominantly focused on stable identities, reputation systems, and the use of rich media. This workshop will extend the agenda by exploring novel research and design approaches for supporting trust and cooperation within social systems.

Three novel approaches will be discussed, but we explicitly encourage participants to nominate additional ones.

- 1. Self-Awareness mechanisms that do not rely on visual identification
- 2. Reparative and reversal mechanisms towards repairing a disrupted interaction
- 3. Social recommendations towards matching individuals with similar behavioral standards

Beyond these theory-led approaches we also encourage submissions describing user-centered design processes in the development of novel social systems.

This workshop will be of interest to:

- Researchers working in established tracks of trust research
- Researchers who have an interest in the topic but whose views have not been widely represented in the debate
- · Industry Experts who are interested in discussing novel design approaches and case studies.

Position papers will be selected by a program committee on the basis of their relevance to the theme and the novelty of their contribution. The workshop will focus on collaboratively formulating future design and research directions.
